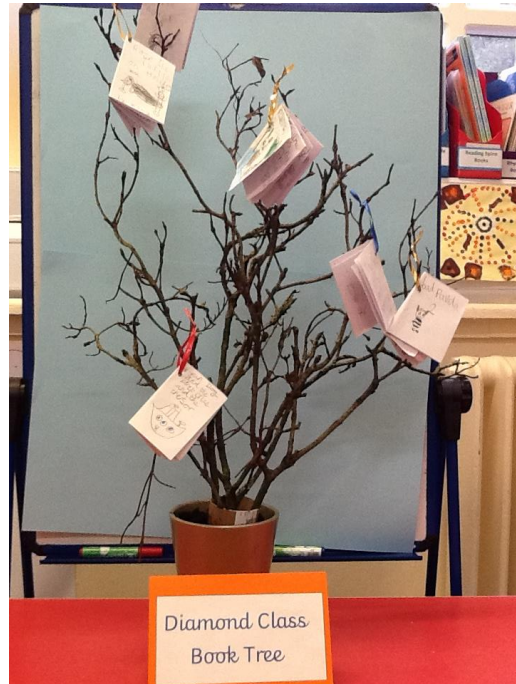
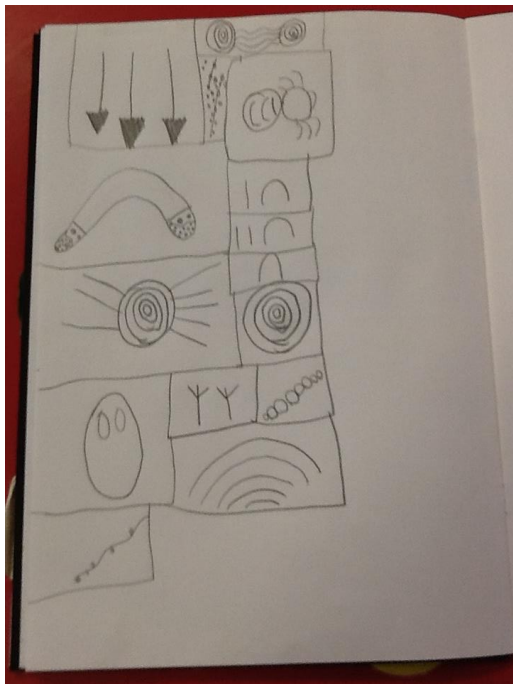
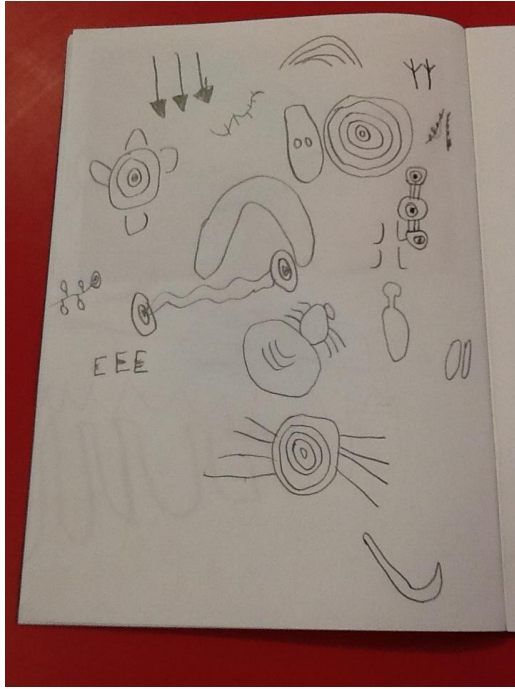
### **School Dinners.**
